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Lesson 31

Adjectives derived from ma-verbs

1. Definition

Certain adjectives are formed by using the present aspects of **ma-verbs**. English adjectives which end in "ble" like *visible*, *potable*, etc. belong to this group. Other adjectives have different endings in English or are given as adjectival phrases. To indicate the antonyms of these adjectives, just put **hindi** before them. Some examples are given in the list below.

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Lesson 32, Unit 1

Pag-verbs (When/Upon, As Soon As)

1. Definition and Formation

Pag and **pang/pan/pam** followed by a verb root mean *when or upon plus the meaning of the verb root*. The resulting verb is the same as the gerund form of that particular verb. If the English translation uses *upon*, the gerund form of the verb in English is used. Simple **pag-verbs** (meaning, no reduplication) can take any aspect depending on the aspect of the verb in the other phrase of the sentence. If a command phrase is used with the simple **pag-verb**, the command verb should be in the infinitive. This will become clearer when we use these verbs in sentences.

To form the English phrase *as soon as plus the meaning of the verb*, the verbs above are repeated and are joined by a linker. When the linkers **g** or **ng** are used, the words are joined by a hyphen. The examples above are rewritten thus: **pag-inom na pag-inom; paglalagay na paglalagay; panghaharanang-panghaharana**. We will call these **reduplicated pag-forms**. The aspect of the verb in these forms is always in the future or command form. For the past aspect, we will use another form and this will be discussed in Unit II. Pronouns, demonstratives, and markers for the doer for both types of **pag-verbs** come from **Set II**.

2. Sentence Pattern

Note that the second part of the sentence ("rest of the sentence") can be interchanged with the first part. For example, sentence 1 below can also be rewritten as: **Matutulog na ako pag-inom ko ng gamot ko.** *I will go to bed when/take/have taken my medicine.* Pay attention to the aspect of the verb in the second part of the sentence. The aspect of the whole sentence depends on it.

Pagka-verbs (After; Soon after)

1. Formation

To express English phrases like *after arriving/after she arrived/after she had arrived*, use the prefix **pagka** with the root of the verb. English phrases like *soon after arriving, right after she arrived, immediately after she had arrived*, are formed by repeating the simple **pagka-form** and joining the reduplicated words with a linker as we did in Unit 1. The tense of the English translation depends on the tense of the verb in the other phrase ("rest of the sentence") and from context.

Lesson 33

Causative-focus Verbs

1. Definition and Formation

The topic of causative-focus verbs expresses the cause of the action. These verbs are derived from doer-focus verbs in **um**, **mag**, **ma**, and **mang/man/mam**. The chart below is a guide to forming **causative-focus verbs**.

doer-focus affix	causative affix	from	example
um	ika- / (i)	gumanda	ikaganda
ma	ika-	magalit	ikagalit
mag	ikapag- / (ipag)	magturo	ikapagturo
mang	ikapang / (ipang)	manginig	ikapanginig

The prefixes in parentheses in the second column are also used with some verb roots but they are seldom used. We will study only those causative verbs prefixed with **ika/ikapag/ikapang** in this course.

Most of the **um-verbs** of becoming, those indicating a change in the course of time, i.e., **gumanda**, **pumayat**; and **ma-feeling verbs**, like **magalit**, **matuwa**, and **ma-accidental verbs** like **ma-ospital**, **mabangga** can be converted to the causative focus by prefixing **ika** to the root. Remember that not all verb roots can take the **ika**-prefix. For example, there is a word for *to cause someone to die*, **ikamatay**, but there is no word for the phrase, *cause someone to kill*, **ikapatay**.

Lesson 34

Other Forms of Adjectives

You were introduced to adjectives earlier in the course. You will learn more adjectives in this lesson. Some adjectival phrases in English like *in a whisper*, *starting to leave*, *fond of candies*, *pro-Democrat*, etc. are rendered in Filipino by adding the prefixes **pa**, **pang/pan/pam/**, **pala**, **mapag**, **mapang**, and **maka** to nouns, verbs, or other adjectives.

1. Pa-adjectives

Pa-adjectives are of three types. The first one denote activity that is intermittent, that is, an activity that happens now and then or occasionally. It is formed by prefixing **pa** to two duplicating syllables. For example:

pa-adjective	meaning
pagala-gala	wander here and there
paminsan-minsan	once in a while
padalu-dalo	attend now and then
pasama-sama	accompany occasionally
patayu-tayo	standing now and then
palakad-lakad	pacing/walking to and fro

The second type denote incipient activity like *starting to leave*, *starting to sink*, etc. This adjective is formed by adding **pa** to the root word. Examples of this type are:

pa-adjective	meaning
pauwi	starting to go home
papunta	starting to go
paalis	starting to leave
palubog	starting to set (as in sun)/sink
paakyat	starting to go up/ascend/climb
pababa	starting to go down/descend

The third type of **pa-adjective** shows the manner in which something is done. Like the second type, **pa** is prefixed to the root word. For example:

pa-adjective	meaning
pangiti	in a smiling manner
pabulong	in a whisper
pasayaw	in a dancing manner
patigilid	sideways
pakanta	in a singing manner

Examples:

1. Pagala-gala sa lansangan si Dadong.
Dadong is wandering in the streets/
roaming around in the streets.
2. Padalu-dalo sa mga miting ng mga Democrat si Jaime.
Jaime attends the meetings of
Democrats now and then.
3. Palakad-lakad sa kuwarto si Honorio habang nanganganak ang asawa niya.
Honorio is pacing the room while his
wife is giving birth.
4. Husband talking to wife on the phone: Pauwi na ako at kasama ko si Jose. Gusto ko sana siyang imbitahing maghapunan sa atin kung okey sa iyo.
I am on my way home and Jose is
with me. I would like to invite him to
have dinner with us if it is okay with
you.
5. Tayo nang umuwi. Palubog na ang araw at ilang minuto na lang e, madilim na.
Let's go home. The sun is starting to
set and in a few minutes it will be
dark.
6. Paakyat na sa bundok ang mga naghahanap sa eroplanong bumagsak.
The people looking for the airplane
which crashed are on their way up
the mountain.
7. "Napakaganda ng kapatid mo," pabulong niyang sabi sa kanyang kaibigan.
"Your sister is so pretty," he said to
his friend in a whisper.
8. Bakit lumalakad ka nang patagilid? Para kang alimango.
Why do you walk sideways? You are
like a crab.

2. a) Pang/pam/pan-adjectives

Like the **pa-adjectives**, these adjectives are of three types. The first type, ordinal numbers, i.e., **pampito-seventh**, were given in an earlier lesson. The two other types will be discussed in this lesson. The second type is called **reservational adjective** and the other, **instrumental adjective**. As the name implies, **reservational adjectives** denote something that is *reserved or intended for use in, on, as. . . etc.* The root to which **pang/pan/pam** is attached is usually a noun. The other type, **instrumental adjective**, is also self-explanatory. Adjectives of this type denote something that is *used in performing the action designated by the verb root to which the prefix is attached.*

Reservational adjectives

pang/pan/pam-adjective	meaning : reserved or intended to be used/ worn at, in, on, etc. . . .
pangkamay	for use on the hand
pang-opisina	reserved for office use
panlakad	reserved for use in walking
pansimba	reserved to be worn in church
pang-summer	reserved to be worn in the summer
pangmatanda	reserved to be worn by old people
pang-eskuwela	reserved to be worn at school
panlamig	reserved to be worn in cold weather
pamparti	reserved to be worn at a party
pambata	reserved to be worn by children
pamasko	reserved to be worn or used at Christmas
pambansa	(reserved for the country)/national
pambahay	reserved/intended to be worn at home

Instrumental adjectives

pang/pan/pam-adjective	meaning: for use in performing . . .
pambili	for use in buying

2. b) Pang/pam/pan-verbs

Some reservational and instrumental adjectives can be made into verbs by the addition of the prefix I. The underlying meanings are the same. Note that not all of the adjectives in the previous pages can be made into verbs, i.e., there is no such verb as **ipambata**, nor **ipambansa**. Remember also that verbs are aspected. Compare the adjectives and verbs below:

3. Adjectives showing inclination towards performing an activity

The word **mahilig**, when combined with a verb, means *fond of or inclined to do that which is designated by the verb*. This was introduced with other adjectives in earlier lessons. The same meaning can be expressed by one-word adjectives prefixed by **pala**, **mapag**, **mapang/mapan/mapam**, and **ma . . . in/hin/nin**.

Pala-adjectives are formed by prefixing **pala** to the verb root. Most of the verb roots come from **um-verbs** and **ma-verbs**, although some **mag-verbs** are also used. Note **palabiro**, for example. There is no such verb as **bumiro**. **Palabiro** comes from **magbiro**.

Most **mapag-adjectives** come from **mag-verbs**. Note that **palabiro**, **palaluto**, and **palaaral** from the table above are also listed in the table below.

Ma . . . in/hin/nin adjectives

Most **ma-feeling verbs** can be changed into adjectives by adding **in/hin/nin** to the verb. As in other instances taken in the past, changes occur when **o** is present in the last syllable of the verb. This adjective also denotes *fondness of or inclination to do something*. Examples of such adjectives are:

magalit	magalitin	inclined to get angry easily
mainggit	mainggitin	inclined to feel envious
mainip	mainipin	inclined to become impatient/bored/annoyed

- Kung hindi ako nagkakamali, isa sa mga tanong nila, e, kung maka-komunista ka. If I am not mistaken, one of their questions was, if you are pro-Communist.
- Kasalukuyang iniimbestigasyon ang bilangguang iyon dahil sa hindi raw makatao ang trato nila sa mga bilanggo. That prison is currently being investigated because it is said that their treatment of prisoners is inhumane.

Lesson 35

Intensive and Reflexive Noun/Pronoun Constructions

1. Mismo in intensive noun/pronoun construction

English pronouns like *myself*, *yourself*, *themselves*, etc., have two different uses. They can be used either as intensive or reflexive pronouns. In Filipino, **mismo** is used to express the intensive use. **Mismo** can be used with nouns or pronouns. It can either follow or precede the noun or pronoun it intensifies or emphasizes. When **mismo** is used before the noun or pronoun, a linker is used, when it follows the noun/pronoun, no linker is used. The markers and the pronouns used depend on the focus of the verbs.

2. Other uses of mismo

Mismo is sometimes translated as some other phrase in English like *right here, right now, in the very heart of, in the very center of* etc. Sometimes **mismo** is not translated in English but it is conveyed through an emphatic stress. See example 1 below:

3. Reflexive construction

As stated earlier, English pronouns like *myself* (*ownself*), *themselves*, etc. are also used in reflexive constructions. To express these sentences in English, we use the word **sarili**, instead of **mismo**. Note the differences in the first example below:
